

# **Association of Liberal Democrat Councillors Strategic Plan 2011-2015**

#### Dear Members and Partners of ALDC

Please find below a draft Strategic Plan for ALDC which aims to cover the remainder of the current Westminster Parliament.

The Plan sets out how we will achieve on two proposed core objectives:

- (1) For there to be more Liberal Democrat Councillors, at every level, throughout Great Britain
- (2) For Liberal Democrat Councillors to be the best

And a proposed third supporting objective:

(3) For ALDC to have the capacity for success, now and in the future.

ALDC has a long and successful history in its own right and through its predecessor organisations the Association of Liberal Councillors and the Association of Social Democrat Councillors. For last 43 years we have helped develop a style of community campaigning which has meant that we have grown to a position where 1 in 5 principle councillors in Britain is a Liberal Democrat.

We want the next step to see further advances at a local level, but we also want a Party which transforms community campaigning into something fit for the 21<sup>st</sup> century.

We recognise that the coming years are going to be both different and challenging to Liberal Democrats as we react to our first period of Government in Westminster for many decades.

What this proposed Strategic Plan sets out is how ALDC is continuing to change as an organisation:

- we are changing from an organisation where the largest source of income was a Party Grant, to one where our largest source of income is our members.
- we are changing from an organisation that mainly provides advice and support to all Liberal Democrats, to one which focuses this effort on ALDC members
- we are changing from an organisation which gets information out using printed materials, including selling printed publications, to one which distributes information online
- we are changing from an organisation which was sometimes seen as distant to one which achieves for Liberal Democrat councillors by working well with partner organisations.
- we are changing from an organisation which has sometimes been seen as 'old fashioned', to one which has high standards of quality and innovation at its heart.



We hope that this plan sets out a process of how we will move forward on these changes over the next four years. For 2011 we've set out some key in-year developments, and will review these each year as the Parliament progresses.

We hope that you like this plan, and would very much welcome any comments or suggestions that you might have.

We will provide advice, support and information to Liberal Democrat local election candidates and their

team:

Specifically:

1a

- we will collate information on Lib Dem target and development candidates in British local elections.
- we will provide a briefing service for candidates and their agents in the months running up to the election including campaigning and strategic advice, election law advice and practical help and ideas, we will continue this up to the deadline for election expenses.
- We will provide a candidate's 'helpline' (telephone and online) for the months running up to the local elections through to the election expenses deadline.

Specific Development Priorities in 2011

Build on the 2010 Candidates Handbook for 2011 and establish this as a regular resource for candidates.

Specifically help candidates/agents with strategy around fighting local elections as a party of Government.

How we will monitor our success

Local Election results.

A post-election survey of candidates to evaluate the service they receive (to be undertaken each May).

We will enable the distribution of financial resources to allow Liberal Democrats to effectively fight local elections.

Specifically:

Specific Development Priorities in 2011

Specifically develop better links with Regional Parties in England around G8 to best link into their own Winning Teams or other developmental work. Also Scotland and Wales for the 2012 local elections.

To launch during 2011 an ALDC fundraising appeal, to be known as the Maggie Clay Fund, to provide small amounts of resource for Lib Dem black hole areas.

- we will seek to ensure the continued existence of a "G8" scheme of grants, administered by ALDC, to allow for an effective distribution of resources between regions and through the electoral cycle
- working with our partners in regional/state parties and the Campaigns Department, we will seek to use G8 grants to develop best campaigning practice, and support local parties to develop their own campaign plans.
- We will develop an additional source of funding to help Liberal Democrat 'black holes' get off the ground through grants, training and mentoring

#### How we will monitor our success

Local election results.

An annual report of G8 which evaluates the number of local parties who have benefited from support, and the success in individual wards supported by G8 (report each summer).

An annual report of the Maggie Clay Fund detailing the amount of monies raised and the number of local parties that have been able to be supported and the success that they have seen (report each summer from 2012).

# We will give Lib Dem volunteer campaigners the tools to campaign for the Liberal Democrats through the provision of resources and materials.

#### Specifically:

- We will produce templates for campaign literature which can be used by volunteer Liberal Democrat campaigners and make these available to our members online. (Need to be mindful about Wales and Scotland)
- We will produce campaign packs, materials and ideas to help Liberal Democrats campaign effectively on a local level.
- We will help promote the existence of campaign materials produced by other parts of the Party.

We will promote and celebrate best practice of Liberal Democrat campaigning, including through an annual awards programme.

#### Specific Development Priorities in 2011

We will significantly improve on the quality of the artwork templates we produce and circulate.

We will identify the correct role for ALDC in the production of 'campaign packs' and significantly improve on the quality of those that we produce, including specifically better communication with the Campaigns Department.

#### How we will monitor our success

Local election results.

An annual post-election survey of members to assess how well received campaign resources are (survey each September).

We will enable Liberal Democrat volunteer campaigners to campaign effectively for the Liberal Democrats through the provision of training and guidance.

Specifically:

- We will play our part in the provision of training to volunteer campaigners, and from this provide training for volunteer Lib Dem campaigners at conferences and at our own standalone training events.
- We will play our part in the provision of guidance to volunteer campaigners, and from this produce guidance on campaigning for Liberal Democrat campaigners and make this available throughout the Party.

We will undertake a review of campaigner training and implement the outcomes of this review.

We will identify the most appropriate way to produce (and sell?) guidance, including looking at online paid for downloads, starting with the production of guidance to replace the 2007 "Winning Election" series.

How we will monitor our success

Number of people who attend ALDC training and their evaluation.
Annual Training Report to Management Committee (each February).

We will be the primary source of intelligence within the party of local elections and local by-elections.

Specifically:

- We will monitor and evaluate the Liberal Democrat performance in local elections and report on this to members, the Party and the public as appropriate.
- We will gather intelligence in advance of local elections, of potential success and challenges.
- We will maintain accurate details of Council balance, control and Liberal Democrat group leadership and make this available to members, the Party and public as appropriate.
- We will monitor local by-elections,

- We will work with other partners to ensure that Liberal Democrat councillors have access to effective leadership training and support.

Build on the 2010 Group Leaders Day, to develop this as a regular part of ALDC's programme.

Specifically develop the package we are able to offer to Lib Dem Council Groups around group away days, linking into our volunteer network.

#### Specific Development Priorities in 2011

We will develop and provide appropriate tools and resources which allow Liberal Democrat councillors to function more effectively.

Specifically:

Roll out of the 2010-2011 upgrades to the MyCouncillor system, and work to get more sites re-activated and supported through help and information.

Develop a directory of useful resources of Lib Dem councillors and local campaigners, with commercial tie-ins as appropriate.
