

KING THE DIFFERENCE

Election Boost for Liberal Democrats

Lib Dem +126 The Liberal Democrats have been given another boost after research shows that they have been the big winners in local byelections since the last General Election.

Between the last election and the end of 1996

the Liberal Democrats gained a massive 126 seats in local byelections nationwide.

> Labour gained just 22 seats while the Tories were the big losers - they were 98 seats down.

BY-ELECTION BOOST FOR LIB DEMS

The Liberal Democrats won victories at four parliamentary by-elections since the last election have made a real difference.

The contests in Newbury, Christchurch, Eastleigh and Littleborough & Saddleworth helped reduce the Conservative Government's majority to zero and helped stop the

Government raising VAT on fuel to 17.5%.

Christchurch victor Diana Maddock piloted the 'Home Energy Conservation Bill' through Parliament.



Columnist switches to Lib Dems

Top newspaper columnist Carol Sarler, who writes for The People, has switched to back the Liberal Democrats from Labour.

She explained her reasons by saying: 'Their commitment to education is as relentless as their honesty is absolute - yes, they say, it WILL cost us. They are more radical by far than Labour.'

They have been quietly honing their skills in local government; they now have more councillors than the Tories.'

Fair Tax Will Boost Schools

The Liberal Democrats have set out new tax plans which will raise £2 billion a year for education. 70% of adults will pay less or no more tax.

The money will be raised by putting an extra penny on income tax and by raising income tax to 50% on earnings above £100,000.

But these rises will be balanced by an increase in the individual tax allowance by £200, benefiting low paid workers most.

The average taxpayer will pay just 45p a week extra - and that is enough to fund a nursery place for every three and four year old and provide more cash for local schools.

All this for just 45p a week:

- a nursery place for every three and four year old whose parents want it;
- cash to reduce class sizes and provide more books and equipment;
- better training and adult education.

Only the Liberal Democrats are willing to back up their commitment to education with guaranteed extra funding.

For just 45p a week extra from the average taxpayer the Lib Dems will start to provide our children with the good quality education they deserve.

SCHOOL SAFETY

"The Government are refusing to provide enough money to make schools safe for children," said Don Foster MP, Liberal Democrat education and employment spokesman.

He has released figures which reveal that this year Education Authorities in England on average received less than one-fifth (18.7%) of their bid for money for essential repairs and maintenance work for schools.

"Over £3 billion is needed by schools in England and Wales simply to make their schools safe for children.

"The figures released today give yet further evidence that children are at risk in the classroom because of persistent capital underfunding by the Government.

"Capital funding in real terms on schools is now roughly half its value 20 years ago. In the age of computers, children are taught in crumbling buildings and use outside loos."

Local Liberal Democrat Jo Bloggs has strongly backed the Liberal Democrats' priorities document, 'Priorities for Britain':

"Priorities for Britain' puts forward a clear set of specific priorities for Great Britain - and states how we would pay for them. It contrasts with the approach of the other two parties, who promise better services and lower taxes, without saying how they would pay."

Priorities for Britain' shows how all our policies are linked in a way which provides a new direction - policies which include:

- · investing in education £2 billion a year more for nursery education and more books and equipment for schools;
- preventing crime and the fear of crime enough resources to provide an extra 3,000 police officers and a requirement for local councils to draw up crime prevention strategies;
- and improving the national health service by providing enough money to employ extra nurses and doctors, reintroduce free eye and dental checkups and cut waiting lists.

Paddy Ashdown MP, launching the document, said:

- "In the coming election it is the Liberal Democrats who will make the difference.
- "After eighteen years of one-party rule, Britain is ready to think and act afresh. It is time for this Conservative Government to go.
- "Britain's next Government must enable our country to face the new century with strong leadership and clear direction.
- "The Labour Party's response to that challenge so far has been little more than warm words, vague promises and woolly evasions.
- "Liberal Democrats will provide the common-sense, clear purpose and unity that Britain needs.
- "Only the Liberal Democrats guarantee to invest in education, invest in Britain's long-term prosperity, put patients first in the NHS and look after the environment. Britain needs the Liberal Democrats to tell the truth about what needs to be done, what it will cost and how we will pay for it."

Crime is the other issue of widespread concern. This leaflet could be very effective in areas where crime has come up as a main issue in Residents' Surveys, or in areas with a lot of pensioners. Extra police officers will be very popular in most of these areas.


POLICE PROMISE



The extra resources will come from £350 million of tax loopholes which will be closed and £200 million from putting 5p on a packet of cigarettes.


